### YONGNAM'S 2QFY2010 NET PROFIT UP 27.2% TO \$\$13.3 MILLION

- Earnings per share improves 24.4% to 1.1 Singapore cents
- Order book remains strong at S\$460 million as at end June 2010

Singapore, August 13, 2010 – Yongnam Holdings Limited ("Yongnam" or the "Group"), a well-established structural steel contractor and specialist civil engineering solutions provider, today reported a 27.2% jump in the Group's net profit to S\$13.3 million for the three months ended June 30, 2010("2QFY2010").

This was largely due to the higher revenue mix from Specialist Civil Engineering which contributed better margins. The Group achieved a gross profit of S\$24.4 million in 2QFY2010, 17.1% higher than the gross profit of S\$20.8 million in 2QFY2009.

Mr Seow Soon Yong, Chief Executive Officer of Yongnam said: "Leveraging on Yongnam's established brand name and unparalleled trusted track record, the Group continues to deliver another strong quarter, with high double-digit growth in net profit.

Moving forward, we believe we are well-positioned to benefit from the consistently high Governmental investments in infrastructure projects in the region. Our strong relationships with all the large construction companies operating in the region also augur well for the Group."

Cumulatively, for the half-year to June 30, 2010 ("1HFY2010"), the Group achieved a 27.8% increase in net profit to \$\$26.4 million.

#### Performance Review

With the completion of the New Delhi Airport in June 2009, the substantial completion of the Dubai Metro by the third quarter of FY2009 and some of its projects at Marina Bay Sands Integrated Resort at the end of last year, Yongnam saw a decrease of 28.3% in revenue from Structural Steelworks, from S\$69.9 million in 2QFY2009 to S\$50.1 million in 2QFY2010. For the quarter under review, ongoing projects like Vista Xchange at One-North, Gardens by the Bay and Crystal Pavilion at the Marina Bay Sands were the key contributors to Structural Steelworks revenue.

Increased contributions from the Group's Marina Coastal Expressway ("MCE") and MRT contracts led to a more than two-fold increase in revenue from Specialist Civil Engineering, which jumped from S\$16.5 million to S\$34.0 million during the same period.

Gross profit registered a 17.1% increase to S\$24.4 million in 2QFY2010 on better margins achieved from this revenue mix. Gross margins improved from 24.1% in 2QFY2009 to 29.0% in 2QFY2010.

For 1HFY2010, gross profit rose 14.8% to \$\$48.7 million whilst group net profit registered a strong 27.8% jump to \$\$26.4 million.

## **Improved Financial Fundamentals**

Supported by its improved bottomline, the Group's earnings per share grew 24.4% from 0.86 Singapore cent in 2QFY2009 to 1.07 Singapore cents in 2QFY2010. Net asset value per share improved from 15.22 Singapore cents as at December 31, 2009 to 16.90 Singapore cents as at June 30, 2010.

Despite the purchase of additional struts required for its various projects, the Group's cash flow from operations, after deducting cash outflow for its investing activities for 2QFY2010, was S\$20.6 million; aided by the cash proceeds from the sale of an investment property. Yongnam's net gearing improved from 0.75 times as at December 31, 2009 to 0.61 times as at June 30, 2010.

#### Outlook

During 2QFY2010, Yongnam secured another three large contracts. It won another two contracts worth S\$56.1 million— the Group's fifth and sixth contracts - for the MCE project, bringing total contract value to S\$364.3 million. In addition, the Group clinched a second prestigious contract in India — a S\$71.1 million contract (awarded to a joint venture company in which the Group has 50% interest) to build a roof structure and steel columns for a new integrated terminal building for the Mumbai International Airport.

All three contracts are expected to contribute positively to the Group's financial performance in FY2010.

Going forward, prospects for the Group remain promising with a healthy pipeline of potential projects which the Group is pursuing in Singapore, Middle East, India and Hong Kong.

In Singapore, potential projects include infrastructural projects like the Singapore Sports Hub, the MRT Downtown Line Phases 2 and 3 and other commercial projects. Overseas, the Group is pursuing infrastructural projects like airport terminals and MRT in addition to commercial projects.

As at 30 June 2010, Yongnam's order book remained strong at \$460 million.

"With our unparalleled track record giving Yongnam a strong competitive edge, we believe the Group is well-positioned to benefit from the promising potential projects in our key markets. As such, we are optimistic that Yongnam will perform well in FY2010," added Mr Seow.
